1st file – PPK-05

The first section of papers in this file are wrapped with a paper which reads 'TH writer (a poet) MSS for ills.' Inside this are other papers similarly wrapped.

- (a) 'Jacob's Dream (originally Inscription for a painting) poss. post. Claybury.' There are no papers.
- (b) The next covering paper is blank. Within it are two handwritten pages, the first a poem titled 'Jacob's Dream' and the second a poem titled 'An Emblem.'
- (c) The next covering paper is also blank. It encloses one handwritten sheet which might be a poem (?) beginning 'As ancient Egypt ...... '
- (d) The next covering paper is blank. It encloses two pages of two handwritten poems 'The Parish Font' and 'Emblem: Ox and Eagle.'
- (e) The next covering page is blank. It encloses one handwritten page a poem which begins 'Master and Mistress Nature ...... '
- (e) The next covering page reads 'TH biography poss. <u>MSS poetry as illustration'</u> It encloses a one page handwritten poem called 'Christmas fragment.'
- (f) The next two handwritten pages are loose. They both are of a poem titled 'Queen Anne's Musicians' with some slight difference in the texts.
- (g) On the inside of the next covering page 'Appreciative references to the seventeenth century poet Henry Vaughan and to the comparatively little known later playwright William Taverner. (Written by Hennell at Claybury 1933-35)) There is one handwritten page headed 'July 10.'
- (h) The next covering page is blank. Inside it is a three page handwritten poem titled 'Hercules?'
- (i) The next covering page is blank. It contains a one page handwritten poem which begins 'O sweet sincerity.'
